Director: "Thank-You!"


In 2017, JUMP distributed 5489 vouchers valued at \$97,634. The most requested voucher was for transportation gas assistance as JUMP spent \$29,567 plus an additional Bus Passes \$5160 and Bikes \$737. Combined JUMP spent a needed \$35,574 for transportation assistance.

Accessible even from a distance, we provided voucher assistance to families and individuals from over 35 towns representing the following (9) Vermont Counties; Addison, Chittenden, Franklin, Grand Isle, Hillsborough, Lamoille, Rutland County, Washington and Windsor.

Informed by JUMP Core Values, in 2018 our primary goals will include: ensure all economically disadvantaged neighbors have improved access to help met basic needs, and increase transportation assistance to better support the working poor,

low wage earners and neighbors with transportation needs.

Grateful, JUMP will continue to look to our untiring supporting Faith Communities and committed volunteers who've played a vital role in JUMP distribution of services.
